Google Scholar h-Index = 30, each component article indicated by the <u>pound (#) sign</u> below, with a total of 4288 citations, averaging ~300 per year for the last 10 years; >800 citations to patient-centered method alone and >250 to more recent medically unexplained symptom/behavioral health care model. From Thompson Reuters Essential Science Indicators Citation Thresholds, the most cited 1% of scientists in Clinical Medicine had 1390 citations to their publications over the preceding 10 years. Removing many nonetheless actively authored or co-authored articles on sleep and one on Goodpasture's syndrome gives a better picture of the impact in psychosocial, mental health, and patient-centered medicine: the h-index is 28, with a total of 2417 citations, averaging >140 per year over the last 10 years, still in the 1% range.
